PennDOT Awards Transportation Economic Recovery Project to Resurface 12 Streets in Center City Philadelphia

King of Prussia – PennDOT District 6 today announced the award of a \$7,144,267 project to C. Abbonizio Contractors, Inc., of Sewell, NJ for the repair and resurfacing of 12 city-owned streets in Center City Philadelphia. The project is financed with funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

Crews will work this year to mill and resurface each street and rebuild curb ramps along each corridor. Construction will begin this spring and finish in October 2010.

The city streets to be resurfaced are:

- 2nd Street between Walnut Street and Market Street.
- 3rd Street between South Street and Market Street.
- 4th Street between South Street and Chestnut Street.
- 8th Street between South Street and Market Street.
- 9th Street between South Street and Market Street.
- 11th Street between South Street and Market Street.
- 12th Street between South Street and Market Street.
- Front Street between Dock Street and Market Street.
- Locust Street between Broad Street and Washington Square.
- Lombard Street between 2nd Street and Front Street.
- Lombard Street between 13th Street and 9th Street.
- Spruce Street between 2nd Street and 38th Street.
- Spruce Street between 4th Street and 2nd Street.
- Spruce Street between Broad Street and 8th Street.
- Pine Street between 15th Street and Broad Street.
- Pine Street between Broad Street and 5th Street.
- Pine Street between 4th Street and Front Street.

In the five-county Philadelphia region, PennDOT is investing \$257.7 million of federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds on 30 transportation projects, which include road and bridge improvements, Intelligent Transportation System installations, traffic signal upgrades, multi-use trails, and curb ramp replacements.

PennDOT has awarded 29 transportation economic recovery projects in the five-county Philadelphia region and 23 have moved to construction.
